

MISSIONS

On December 16th, \$700 worth of gift cards were delivered to Haven House to be used to buy Christmas gifts for the families there. \$675 worth of monetary donations were given by the VPC congregation to buy those gift cards. A \$25 gift card was also donated. What a wonderful expression of the spirit! Many, many thanks to the congregation for spreading some Christmas joy!

Thank you also to those of you who completed the Education Events and Resources surveys. These surveys were an attempt to gauge community interest in a variety of topics in order to provide relevant and useful programming for the surrounding community. There were 10 completed at the October QPR training, 28 were completed at the RAMM Pantry in November, and 11 were later completed by the VPC congregation. The #1 topic of interest in all groups was Loneliness, #2 was Grief, and #3 as Dementia/Alzheimer's. Based on those results, the plan is that appropriate programming can then be organized and implemented.

Brrr!! Now that the REAL winter weather has arrived, community outreach is especially appreciative of gently used blankets, afghans, and throws; gloves, and sturdy shoes and boots. Sorted and flattened plastic bags to make mats are also needed.

As always, don't forget beverage tabs for Shriners, personal care items (shampoo, conditioner, deodorant) for RAMM, non-perishable food items for VPC Pantry, paper goods and cleaning supplies for Haven House, and a small donation to honor a loved one's January birthday in the Birthday Blessings church.


ADULT SUNDAY SCHOOL
