

From the Manse

Those of you who know me are aware that my phone is never too far away from my side. As unhealthy as I think that is, I still feel the pull of technology and the false connectedness one gets from a constantly updating Facebook newsfeed. The majority of what I end up reading is positive, uplifting, and helps maintain connections that are important to me.

For me, this is particularly the case with my Scottish heritage. As much as I value my status as an American citizen (I voted yesterday!) I'm still Scottish by birth and I enjoy staying connected in some way with that fact. For example, I've been struck recently by some of the pictures that have been posted from Scotland. There in Scotland, fall (or autumn as they call it) is further on in its progress than it is here. Their more stable, wetter climate has already caused the leaves to change color and the shedding of leaves to begin. I think we're a week or two away from that here. It's started, but isn't as far along in the cycle as it is there. Noticing this difference in seasonal manifestation, got me thinking about how we behave as church.

You see, it is the right thing for the leaves from the Scottish trees to be on the ground. In the cycle of their seasonal year, were the leaves not shed, there would be something wrong. By the same token, our climate here in Ohio is not quite yet ready for bare trees and so some leaves remain on the branches. Were the trees here to discard their foliage prematurely, that too would be a sign that something is wrong.

But what does this arboricultural diatribe have to do with church? Well, I realized that what is often right in one place may not be right in another. What may suit one congregation may be completely inappropriate in another. Just because one congregation worships in one style, doesn't mean that everyone should.

The key point here is that change "out of season" can be unhealthy. Changing because "them over there" have changed can have disastrous consequences, in much the same way as if Ohio trees decided to shed their leaves because they heard that the Scottish trees had already done so. The reality is that change is all around us. There's no escaping the fact that life is never stagnant and there is always the opportunity to adjust and absorb the changes that are happening in our environment. But our reasons for change should not be based on what someone else is doing. They should be based on what is healthy for us in our context, at the place where we are.

As a pastor, I find myself constantly impressed by other pastors and what they achieve with their congregations. The pressure to compete is real. But it's also deceptive, because there are no guarantees that what works in a colleague's congregation would work here. Instead, I rejoice in the uniqueness of what we have here at Venice Presbyterian, always prayerfully looking out for **healthy** opportunities for us to grow and adjust to the realities of our congregational life.

I say all of this because, after a year as your pastor, there may be a few things that I might want to tweak a little, in terms of our life together as a congregation: nothing major, and nothing that should cause any great concern, but rather changes that will (hopefully) improve our witness to the Gospel in Ross and beyond. Because, there is one area where seasonality doesn't apply. Paul's advice to Timothy remains as true today as it did 2000 years ago. "Preach the word! Be ready in season *and* out of season." (2 Tim. 4:2a) There is never a wrong time to spread the Good News of Jesus Christ, crucified, risen, and ascended.

May we all seek out opportunities for healthy change, recognize the dangers of unhealthy change, and be ever vigilant for opportunities to share the Gospel of Christ – in season and out of season.

What are we Learning this Month?

We will be talking about what we are thankful for. Our Bible story for November is Jesus Calms the Storm and Jesus Walks on Water.

Blue Class (Mrs. Baker) – We will continue to work on letters and letter sounds, focusing on the letters at the beginning of our names. We are still working on learning the letter chant! We will practice rhyming and clapping the syllables in words. We will also continue working on counting and number recognition, focusing on 6-10. We will begin practicing songs for our Christmas program.

PUMPKIN GOOEY BUTTER CAKE

CRUST:

One 18-1/4 oz. yellow cake mix

1 egg

1 stick butter, melted

**Preheat over to 350 degrees. Combine ingredients and mix well. Pat into lightly greased 13 x 9 pan.

FILLING:

One 8 oz. package cream cheese, softened

2 eggs

1 tsp vanilla

1 stick butter, melted

1 can pumpkin 15 oz.

1-1/2 tsp pumpkin pie spice

One 16 oz. box powdered sugar

**Beat cream cheese until smooth. Add eggs, vanilla, and pumpkin pie spice. Add pumpkin and melted butter and beat. Add powdered sugar and mix well. Spread over cake mixture. Bake for 40 to 50 minutes. You want the center to still be a little gooey, so do not overbake.



THE SCOOP ON OUR COUNTRY CHRISTMAS BARBECUE

It seems that every year, I get compliments on the barbecue at Country Christmas. And, every year, I say, "it's not my recipe, it came from Milly Webber." Milly was a long time member and servant of our church. For many years, she worked as the head of the Elda Elementary Cafeteria. Milly once told me she used her Elda recipe for our Country Christmas sandwiches. I asked her to break down the recipe, so I could prepare it for my own family. She did, and what you see here, is that recipe, in Milly's own handwriting! The only change that I have made is that I use Montgomery Inn Barbecue Sauce, not Heinz. In 1988, Milly asked me to Co-Chair the Country Christmas Kitchen with her. And, I did. By Christmas of 1989, Milly had passed away. I have been chairing the Country Christmas Kitchen ever since. For a couple of years, Peggy Gries and Jeanne Mountsier used their own barbecue recipes to make our sandwiches. Other than those few times, I have used Milly's. You may have noticed that our VPC Kitchen door has a plaque on it saying, "Milly Weber Memorial Kitchen." Milly's memorials, along with donations from other church groups, made it possible for me to remodel the church kitchen in 1990. Anyone who knew and loved Milly knew that she was an angel here on earth! So, this year, If you choose the barbecue sandwich at Country Christmas and think it is tasty, think of Milly Weber and thank her for her contribution.
